**Plenary Indulgence** - Traditionally November has been a month where the Church places a special focus on the Communion of Saints, and in particular on praying for the souls of the deceased. With that said, the Church, by the power given to her by Christ himself in matters of binding and loosing (Matt. 16:18-19) offers us this month some opportunities to gain a plenary indulgence on behalf of a soul in purgatory.

According to the Code of Canon Law and the Catechism of the Catholic Church: "An indulgence is a remission before God of the temporal punishment due to sins whose guilt has already been forgiven, which the faithful Christian who is duly disposed gains under certain prescribed conditions...". The opportunities and requirements to gain a plenary (full remission) indulgence are as follows.

A Plenary indulgence is granted each day from Nov. 1-8 by visiting a cemetery and praying for the dead... along with this is the requirement of confession once during those days... receiving communion each day you wish that indulgence to be granted... and lastly saying a prayer for the intentions of the Pope (which can consist in one Our Father and one Hail Mary)

*Note: For indulgence to be plenary (complete remission) one is not to have attachments to sin, otherwise one gains only a partial indulgence. For more information on indulgences see*
