23rd Sunday in Ordinary Time Reflection

Everyone commits a mistake. Everyone falls short of the glory of God. (Romans 3:23). But our God is merciful. He forgives our sins if we come to Him with a sincere desire to repent and to amend our life.

The gospel passage today is very clear on how to discipline a fellow believer. First, lovingly talk to him or her in private. Never shame him or her in public. If he does not listen, let two or three witnesses talk to him and still, if he refuses to listen, let the whole church make the decision. The rest is up to God.

Listening is the key to healing and reconciliation. It works both ways. God listens to our prayers but we need also to listen to Him. In the area of discipline, we need to listen to each other first. Each one has a different background and each of us has a story to tell. In the first verse of our reading, we can easily win over our brother who sins against us if he knows how to listen but we also need to listen to him. Who knows, maybe our brother sinned against us because of our own wrongdoings.

The best part in our reading is that when we come together to solve a problem on discipline or any problem for that matter, God is present in our midst.

That is why it is important to start any activity with a prayer in order to seek His wisdom and might. So let us reflect on our behavior. How many times did we become a stumbling block for others to achieve their dreams?
